



The Super Sale Spring and Fall Fling team have been active over the past years adjusting to the times, a pandemic, and the current environment. We successfully changed from the huge once-a-year Super Sale into two smaller but successful sales and added Easter Eggs and Peg's Relish sales to round out our fundraising efforts. It has also been very important to us to provide opportunities for fun and fellowship, not just for our Hanover family, but for volunteers, contributors from outside Hanover, and for the public coming to the sales.

We've been monitoring the effort and volunteer support involved in hosting these activities with what parts attract the most community attention and what parts raise the most money for Hanover's work and mission. We are also dialing in the traffic pattern changes on Baynard Boulevard, the limited calendar window to successfully host these types of events, and the impact that weather and parking have on customers. Storage at Hanover has also always been challenging. The exciting renovations that are ongoing and the increased community use of our building also create challenges, because we often receive donations for sales year-round.

With that background, we are now looking into the future and what would have the most positive impact, considering our space and more limited volunteer energy. We have decided this year to pause on the Spring and Fall Fling sales and instead look for different opportunities to partner with other groups and activities and make our Hanover presence known. We will continue making and selling Easter Eggs and Peg's Relish. Stay tuned for more exciting info. We are so grateful for all of our faithful Hanover volunteers, and our supporters from outside Hanover.
