Silas Sheffer-O'Neill will be joining the Hanover staff as a student pastor from September, 2025 through

May, 2026 under the supervision of Pastor Stephany. Silas is under the care of the Calvary Presbyterian Church, where his husband Rev. Brent Sheffer-O'Neill serves as the pastor. Silas and Brent were recently married on June 28<sup>th</sup> this year.

Silas has discerned a very focused calling to chaplain ministry. Enrolled at the United Lutheran Seminary in Philadelphia, he is completing his second year in the Masters of Divinity program.



Silas' field work will consist of 10 hours a week. He will be working closely with the "Ties That Bind Ministry," preaching every second Sunday, teaching Bible study classes, helping with outreach ministries, assisting with pastoral care responsibilities and on occasion, singing with the choir. The New Castle Presbytery will be providing compensation for Silas while he is completing his 10 hours a week of Ministerial Field study work.

**November**—On **Saturday, November 1, 4pm**, we'll have a lovely voice and piano song cycle of *Jane the Quene*, that details the too-short life of Lady Jane Grey, *The Nine Days Queen*. Paige Cutrona is the soloist, and Jonathan Fox Powers is the pianist. The concert begins with a short video introducing Lady Jane, her Tudor Family, and the circumstances which led to her ascension to the throne. The song cycle is throughperformed, the nine movements lasting approximately thirty minutes, followed by a question-and-answer period and time for open discussion with the audience about the piece, the history surrounding it, and how the story resonates with them in this modern age.

**December**—**Christmas Eve** is always a special night of music. The Hanover Choir will be joined by Gus Mercante and Shannon Booth-Johnson as we celebrate the birth of our Savior. The service is on **Wednesday, December 24**, with prelude music beginning at 4:45pm, and the service begins at 5pm.


- The next scheduled event will be a caregiver's luncheon on **Saturday**, **August 16** at **12:30PM**. Please call the church office to reserve your place.


