Finance Report

The Hanover finance committee provided November's finance reports to Session for its December 2025 meeting. At 92% of the year, we had received 88% (\$180,149) of our 2025 budgeted income pledge goal of \$205,000. The good news is this is significantly better than at the same time in 2024. The challenging news is that all of our regular income as of November 30th (\$253,328) is not enough to cover all of our expenses of \$273,251 through November, so we are running a deficit of almost \$20,000.

Our pledges for 2026, as of December 10, 2025, equal \$147,119 from 40 pledges. This is also significantly improved over this time in 2024. We are very grateful to all of you who have supported Hanover, financially, and have pledged to continue doing so. Pledges are gratefully received at any time during the year. We need all gifts, because every gift – every donation – makes it possible for Hanover to serve others with love and compassion. Property Committee Updates



Boiler for the Church:

In October and November, multiple repairs have been necessary to have the steam boiler operate efficiently and up to code. The cost of repairs total \$4,623. A new cap on the furnace vent system had to be custom made and was installed in October. A deteriorating pipe also needed to be replaced and was also repaired in October. Then the boiler pumps failed, requiring pipe and electrical repairs in November.

Alley Fence and Gate:

The property and finance committees joined together in a request to the Session to approve funds to have a fence and gate installed at the entrance to the alley. We received a quote from A&R Iron Works in the amount of \$5,395. The fence will be the same material as the handicap ramp railing. It will be 60 inches high and have a double gate. The gates will have a quick release on the inside as an emergency exit to get out of the alley. The gate will also have a key and coded access from the Baynard side. Recently, we have had an increase in issues related to homeless individuals using the alley. We also have had trash receptacles stolen. To protect property and increase safety, we feel the fence and gates are necessary.

Funding through JSC for Storage:

In partnership with Jefferson Street Center, a grant request was submitted to the Chichester duPont Foundation. In December, JSC received funding to renovate and add storage in the former dressing area outside of the bathroom located in the stairwell on the Baynard Blvd side of the church. As the use of the Community Hub increases, we need to store equipment and supplies in a safe and efficient way and this funding will definitely help with that.

Ignite Funding from New Castle Presbytery:

Hanover Church is a grateful recipient of funding to enhance our sound and video system in the sanctuary and also to enhance our portable wireless system. We submitted a request for funding to purchase additional wireless microphones, microphone stands, speakers, transmitters, and receivers. Through David Harris, we were able to connect with an expert in the field. He told us we have a good system overall, which is good news. We look forward to improving it for worship and for outside use by the community.

Movie Discussion - *The Hate U Give* – Sunday, January 11, 2026

Join us after worship on Sunday, January 11 for a special screening of the critically acclaimed film *The Hate U Give*. We'll gather in the front of the sanctuary at about 12:15PM to view and discuss the movie.

The Hate U Give is a powerful and thought-provoking film based on the bestselling young adult novel by Angie Thomas. It tells the story of Starr Carter, a teenager who moves between two worlds: the poor, mostly black neighborhood where she lives and the wealthy, mostly white prep school she attends. Her world is upended when she witnesses the fatal police shooting of her childhood friend, Khalil. As public outrage grows, Starr finds herself at the center of a national conversation, facing pressure from all sides to find her voice and speak out for justice.



This movie addresses urgent themes of racism, police violence, identity, and the courage it takes to stand up for what's right. It is rated PG-13 for mature themes and language and is recommended for teens and adults.

We hope you'll join us for this meaningful event as we explore how faith calls us to respond to injustice and to love our neighbors boldly and bravely.




